What's Up With Carol Dalton (11)

Just about everyone who moves to Park City is motivated by the terrific opportunity for outdoor activities. In the case of **Carol Dalton (11)** and family, it has become their culture.

Carol and husband Joe came here originally in 1993 to learn to ski. **"We thought Park City would be a great change from the hustle, bustle and pretentiousness of South Florida and a good town for our school age kids"**

Their oldest was headed to college at FSU, Joe was a Delta pilot and Salt Lake City was a base. Carol was a childbirth educator and could work anywhere. **"So in 1995, we sold our house and moved. It was the best thing we ever did"**

Park City now holds the record for where Carol has lived the longest. **"It will be 19 years in the fall. I grew up in the Maryland suburbs of Washington D.C. and have also lived in St. Thomas, VI, Key West, FL, Harper's Ferry, WV, Beeville, TX and Boca Raton, FL. "**

It is easy to understand why Park City holds the record. To say the Dalton family is 'into' outdoor sports is a total understatement. **"We love everything about being in Park City. We learned to snowshoe, x-country ski and mountain bike. We took up hiking, camping and downhill skiing. Who has to go to a gym?"**

The Daltons center their family get-togethers on being outdoors. **"We all love to kayak, ride rivers, scuba dive or snorkel, camp, ski and hike. It just depends on the season! When we decide on a family trip- we usually rent a house that offers outdoor activities. In Key West for example, the rental had three kayaks, a swimming dock, snorkel and fishing gear. We were all in heaven. Joe and I together do at least one international bike tour a year. This year, it will be two tours- Italy and Viet Nam."**

Carol also became heavily involved in the community as a volunteer for the schools and the Newcomers' Club. **"I love feeling part of the community."**

For that reason, Carol applied to the Leadership Program in hopes it would give her an inside view and understanding on how our city, county and state were run. **"It made me more open-minded to have a grasp of the complexities of most issues. A big bonus was the connections made with my fellow class 11 mates!"**

Even though Carol loves living in Park City, she and Joe are frequent flyers to many interesting places around the world. Since they mostly do bicycle touring, they connect more easily with the people and culture. Her experiences have given her thoughtful insights.

"People are inherently good everywhere and for the most part share the same values. Love of family and children are one of those values, in which it is fun to share a connection. In Turkey I had tea with a beekeepers family, who spoke no English. However the grandmother and I were able to gloat over our grandchildren (I had a picture of baby Naia with me). In Laos, I had some somber discussions with our Lao bike guide over the lack of family planning and resulting poverty. Noom was soon getting married. I explained the English concept of quality over quantity. And how it pertains to having children. A few days later, when we said goodbye

and I wished him much happiness in his marriage, he looked me in the eye and said-quality not quantity. Wow, I felt in a small way I made a difference!" I asked Carol about her favorite thing to see out her window and her answer was immediate and enthusiastic.....**"Moose!!! They have become our family totem."**

"Joe and I just celebrated 30 years of marriage, although it is more like 15 since he is an airline pilot. Joe left Delta in 2005 and joined Virgin America in 2007. Raeanon lives in San Diego, is a planner at UCSB and on the Ocean Beach planning commission. She is married to Dan and have a spirited 2 year old -Naia. Rob is in Dillon Montana getting a degree (finally) in Environmental Interpretation, which he says makes him more desirable as a river guide. Caitlin, after spending a year in Vietnam teaching English, and becoming certified as a reiki and yoga master, has now decided to go for a masters at the U in health promotion. I have been teaching kids to ski at PCMR for the last several years, which is quite the coup for one who learned to ski at 38! My other "job" is organizing bicycle tours abroad for small groups. 14 ladies will be biking southern Croatia in May. In November, join us in Viet Nam!"

Builders Association, local architects and local builders to develop a green building checklist for the Park City/Summit County area.

What began as a 3-4 month effort turned into a year plus project to launch a green building program in our area. Work included research into other green building programs, current building codes, coordination with multiple stakeholders throughout the community-and even flying the head of Build Green Colorado to Park City to meet with the project team.

The end result is a program now owned and run by the Park City Area Homebuilders Association called Build Green Utah. Despite the recession, the program and associated green building education is still in existence.

Our City Tour: Ketchum & Sun Valley, Idaho and Jackson, Wyoming.

In Ketchum/Sun Valley, we were addressed by city leaders who talked about affordable housing, traffic concerns from the only ingress into the valley during "rush hour". We found that Park City has done a considerable amount more to accommodate our work force and create community. In Jackson, Wyoming, we saw some wonderful examples of workforce housing and bike paths. We had dinners with various city leaders and we appreciated the access and their willingness to spend time with our group.

THEN.....What we did during our year:

We found that once we decided on our project, we divided up into groups that would help to actualize our goal. There were some great connections forged. Some of our favorite modules were ethical leadership, city/county government and our state government module in which we were addressed by, among others, Jake Garn, Ralph Becker, Jenny Wilson and Gary Herbert.
