Colin DeFord (17) was born in Dallas, Texas but lived in a number of other states; California, New York, Connecticut and Louisiana and briefly in Athens, Greece before settling in Park City in 2007.

When asked about adventuring...Colin admitted that he does like adventures, but the days of backpacking through South America with college buddies and hiking along the rim of active volcanoes in Hawaii are behind him...at least for the foreseeable future. ***"Currently, I find my greatest adventures are found within my career."*** Colin's work as a Technical Producer for major live sports and entertainment programming is well-known in the industry and he's

been awarded several Emmy Awards for his efforts. ***"I've traveled around the world for work and taught myself...on-the-fly...enough foreign languages (conversationally) to get by in another country, successfully get a show on the air in difficult places and order some very interesting cuisine. This summer, however, was a much tamer version of adventuring, as I consulted with Fox Sports on the US Open Golf coverage, which required over 100 cameras, more than 600 crew members and 12 plus hours of golf coverage per day, set across 4 days."*** As you can see, Colin also 'cleans up' rather nicely as he works his annual gig as a technical producer at the Academy Awards.

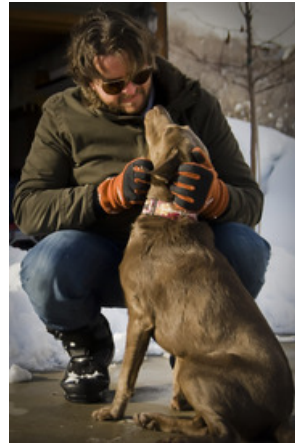

A member of Class XVII whose project was CIVILITY, Colin was very impressed with what he experienced on their City Tour. ***"We visited Fort Collins and Estes Park, Colorado. Fort Collins was eye-opening for me, especially their relationship with the university, their technology incubator, their innovative approach to affordable housing and the abundant bike lanes and mentality of community bike transportation as a first choice to get around."***



Hopefully, participation in Leadership Park City helped prepare Colin when he ratcheted up his community involvement by joining the Snyderville Basin Planning Commission in 2012 and is serving his second term. Colin finds one of the biggest challenges for him personally, is getting the public to be engaged. ***"When processing applications, the majority of the work we do is administrative in nature and requires the Commission to evaluate from fact; not opinion, emotion or clamor. But, as a local, I also understand how vital it is that my neighbors feel they are being heard."***

He added, ***"The fun part of being on the Commission comes when we work as a team on the General Plan and to update the code. The Basin has a turnover approximately every 10 years so it is important that we check in with the Basin residents to confirm the General Plan is consistent with the community's desires. It's our ultimate goal to maintain the General Plan as a living, breathing, growing document. I also very much enjoy the informal work sessions that we often have with the applicants. It's a great way to become really familiar with a project, to speak with the applicant and give, what I hope, is helpful input."***

Leadership Park City launched Colin onto the Planning Commission and now he hopes to launch from there to County Council with the upcoming November election. Remember that this year, you will be voting by 'mail-in-ballot', so look for those in the mail be sure and return it on time by putting on a stamp and getting into the US mail or dropping the envelope off into a ballot box located in several places (to be announced) around town.
