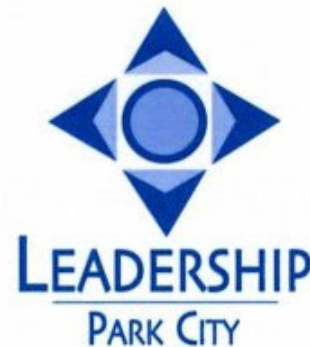

What's Up With Dick Pick (16)

Richard 'Dick' Pick (16) has been in Park City since 1996. After graduating from University of Wisconsin with a degree in chemical engineering, he and wife Sally moved quite a bit; Thousand Oaks, CA, Denver, Grand Junction and back to Denver, CO before Park City.

Like many of us, they hadn't planned to make Park City their permanent home but by the time he retired in 2004, they knew this was where they wanted to stay. Dick's career was in the natural resource extraction industry so Park City's mining history immediately drew his interest and he got involved with the Park City Historical Society.

"I started out just doing some research at the museum library, then became a board member and then served as President of the Board during the renovation and expansion of the museum we have today. Those were some very busy years. Although I remain active and help where I can I am no longer on the board."



A Life-long Passion

Dick's long-time love of photography, birds and nature have combined to form his current passion. *"My photography today is a direct result of what I have enjoyed throughout my life. I have been a birder for as long as I can remember and I have always treasured the solitude of our wilderness areas, most notably our*



national parks and monuments. So it is not surprising that my photography consists almost entirely of birds and our wilderness areas."

He got his first camera during college when everything he shot was black and white film. *"We always had a darkroom back then and would develop our own film and make our own prints. I transitioned to color transparency film and then to digital. So, I have kind of been through it all. I am really glad I could start with film and transition to digital."*

Dick thinks of John and Barbara Gerlach as his mentors. *"They are a great team. John is very technical and Barbara is very good with composition. For print making I study with Charles Cramer. I believe he is one of absolute best anywhere. He was one of Ansel Adams students and you can always see his latest images at the Ansel Adams Gallery in Yosemite."*

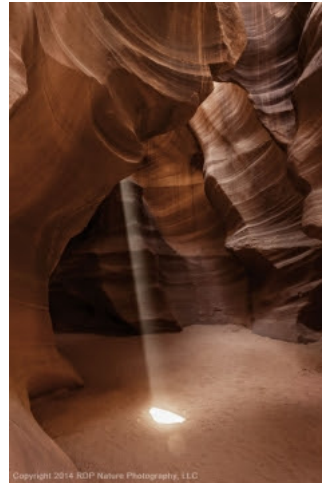


Dick has his own philosophy. *"The way I look at it is like this. The camera is the instrument we use to record the image, the photograph is made with the eye, the heart and the mind."*
