What's Up With Judy Horwitz (19)

Born and raised in Glencoe, IL a suburb on the North Shore of Chicago, Judy Horwitz is somewhat of a novelty. Prior to moving to Park City, she had lived her entire life in one town and in only two homes....the one belonging to her parents and the one she and husband Don lived in for 45 years.



Being golfers and sailors, Judy and Don took advantage of Chicago's short summers to hit the courses and Lake Michigan but when ski season came around...they visited our mountains for the snow. **"The first time we came to Park City was in 1977 for a**

ski vacation with our daughters Gail, then age 6, Linda, 8 and Terry, 10." Next they purchased a ski condo in upper Deer Valley in 1986 and finally moved into the condo full time in 2010.

It was time for retirement and a new adventure. **"We watched our friends becoming 'snowbirds' on both coasts of Florida, in Arizona and the California desert and we said this is not the life for us. We wanted the active life in these gorgeous mountains."**

Actively Retired



Judy is what I like to call "actively retired". In the early years, she was a researcher in the world of advertising but then became a mother and a very busy volunteer. "I consider and call myself 'a professional' volunteer and political activist, doing a wide range of activities from hands-on-work, fund raising, grant giving to policy designing for school and not-for-profits which focus on social service, health and welfare (especially for women and children) and the arts." When Judy moved here full time, she wanted to learn about the city and become an active participant, which is what drew her to the Leadership Park City Program.

Judy, a member of Class XIX, loved her leadership year and misses everyone in her class.....**"Which is the best!" adds Judy. Alumni are still able to connect through the alumni association (LPCA). Although, Judy is a member, she doesn't feel as connected as she would like. "This was the most supportive, respectful, inclusive and fun group of people. I was definitely the "gamey" mother hen. Time does go on and people become busy with their work, family and other activities. Several members of our class have moved away but now, sadly, we are coming together again with our shared tragic loss of Jon Henry. Over the years I've thought about having a "reunion party" for Class XIX; now I am definitely going to do it....either this spring or summer-better late than never."**

On the other hand, Judy does feel very connected to Park City. **"My husband and I try to take advantage of everything that PC has to offer. I recently completed my two terms on the Park City Advisory Board**

(PCAB) and am now serving on the Grants Committee of the Women's Giving Fund and the RAP/Tax Cultural Committee. I truly believe that being involved adds a richness to my life."

Perfect in PC

So, what would a 'perfect Park City day' include for Judy? *"Every day is a 'perfect day' in Park City. I wake up in the morning and no matter what the season or what the weather, I see those gorgeous mountains and am happy. It doesn't hurt that 4 to 5 days a week I take a 7:30 am exercise class at Silver Mountain Spa and then almost every day...do something physical (ski, golf, hike or bike) with my husband and/or friends. Afternoons with 'good works' bridge, a craft project, a museum (not a museum in this world I don't love) and reading."*



Continuing with.....*"Dinner at home or out with my husband or with friends and then a movie, play, opera, ballet or a favorite TV series. We are blessed with so much here in PC and in SLC, of which we take advantage. Must admit I love packed days with lots of activities and people. Figure I can rest when I'm 'old'!"*

Bucket List



As far as bucket list items....Judy seems to be ticking them off along the way. *"I have been blessed with a wonderful life, traveled the world, and have been lucky enough to have so many experiences. I still want to see all of the National Parks and visit all of the Presidential Libraries and Museums (only a few left), travel to Antarctica, Iceland, South Africa and Bali. Maybe parachute out of a plane....and learn to enjoy alone and down time."*

Judy lives by the philosophy her mother preached, "You won't regret things you do, only those you don't do." and she suggests this for everyone. *"It is up to each alumni to learn about what is going on in PC and Summit County, the various organizations and their needs and wants. Then it is up to each individual to contact the ones that interest them. I learned long ago that no matter how qualified or well known you are, not-for-profits will rarely pursue you (except for money)."* Judy has learned the benefits of giving time to her community and to organizations which makes us all a little richer.

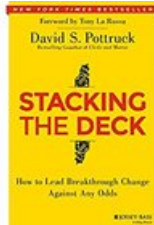
