What's Up With Mark Harrington (4)

Anyone who thinks lawyers are boring needs to meet our City Attorney and Class 4 alum, Mark Harrington.



Born on the east coast, Adams, Massachusetts, to be specific, the eventual move to Park City was a seed planted very, very early during Mark's growing up years in the 70's when he came here to visit family. He didn't exactly 'beeline' it to Park City, as he touched down in Boston, MA, Hilton Head, SC, San Francisco, CA and Eugene, OR before planting roots here.

City Attorney since 1999, Mark came by the position in a circuitous route. *"After backpacking for a week with my Aunt Jennifer, who was a landscape architect and trails planner for Park City in the 1980's,"* explained Mark, *"I shadowed an Assistant City Attorney for about a week in 1982 when I was a sophomore in high school. He was litigating an old land title case and we spent much of the week researching files in the County Courthouse in Coalville, visiting with the friendly clerks, eating lunch at a diner and I felt the whole thing resembled a scene out of any number of Jimmy Stewart movies. He made the mistake of telling me if I ever went to law school....to call him. So, many years later...I did!"*

By that time, the former PC Assistant Attorney was working for a firm in SLC specializing in federal land use and Indian law matters. Mark was hired by the firm as a summer law clerk in 1991 and 92. *"I quickly came to love the proactive nature of municipal law, particularly the ability to make a difference in your community and to problem solve rather than simply advocate on behalf of a singular client after a conflict had arisen."*

In 1993, the SLC firm Mark worked for, won a bid to perform services for Park City on a contract basis which Mark frequently fulfilled and by 1994, the City Attorney hired him away from the firm to serve as her assistant. *"I served as her Assistant and then Deputy City Attorney from 1994-1999."*

Mark, Allison and Cormac

Mark's family here in Park City is made up of wife, Allison Pitt (14) who is part of a multi-generational Summit County family. Allison is also an attorney and a Leadership alum. *"Her father was born in Miner's Hospital and grandparents lived on Park Avenue for many years."* Mark and Allison's son Cormac is 5 years old and has all the personality of the family. *"We also have a Siberian husky, Kodah, AKA "LD" (Last Dog).*

importance but you'll notice movies headed the list. Mark is part of the KPCW Friday Film Review Team and can be heard on a regular basis with individual reviews and as part of Rick Brough's film panels.

His interest in movies was nurtured even prior to interest in the law. **"My hometown didn't have a regular movie theater, but it did have a drive-in movie. Outdoor films became a source of escape and mischief during my small town adolescence, which is best described as a blend between and the plots of BEAUTIFUL GIRLS (1996), CINEMA PARADISO (1988) and DAZED AND CONFUSED (1993)."**

As a dorm resident adviser at Brandeis University, Mark organized a 'movie night' and arranged for an English prof to host post-viewing roundtables over pizza. He also augmented his legal and political studies with comparative media classes and his own film syllabus. **"Before law school, I lived within walking distance of the Haight's Red Vic movie theatre in San Francisco. Enamored with its rows of couches as the only seating...I quickly became drawn to documentary, independent and international films."**

What are Mark's top three favorite movies of all time? **"CASABLANCA (1942), REAR WINDOW (1954) and a tie for third between CINEMA PARADISO (1988) and CITY OF GOD (2003)"**

A movie buff in the 'Land of Sundance' has to have a favorite festival experience. Mark's is Emmy Rossum singing in the Library Theatre after the premiere of SONGCATCHER (2000).

A perfect Park City day in Mark's world is magical but quite daunting to someone without super human power and a stomach the size of a barrel!

"Start off with great coffee and a long walk with the dog during sunrise on McLeod Creek Trail. Be back home in time to bake chocolate croissants for Cormac while reading several news/political/film/critical/food sites, blogs, papers and magazines. Bike to work where I solve an unsolvable problem to the benefit of the community in a manner which upsets only a relatively small number of co-workers and/or residents. Disappear for a swim or trail run with Allison and a Salmon Boxy, curry fries and pint for lunch at Flanagan's before sneaking away for an afternoon matinee with Alison or Cormac after which his grandparents arrive to pick up Cormac so Alison and I can bike over for a roof-top dinner with good friends at the Wine Dive enjoying a buffet of mussels, scallops, small plates and pizzas before attending an outdoor Sundance film at City Park or a Deer Valley concert with an assortment of pastries and great wine; ending with one or more glasses of Macallan Fine Oak 21 whiskey, handed to me by someone in the front seats before biking home to pack for an upcoming trip and tuck Cormac and Allison into bed."

As we all know, the highlight of the program is choosing the project. A new project selection approach was implemented this year with the recommendation made by Leadership Class XXI. This year's participants were asked to submit 250 word project proposals for all participants to read prior to the decision-making day. Ten proposals were submitted and after presentations and two rounds of voting, a decision was made to implement a project that was loosely tied to Latino Integration. Team leader, Patton Murray, hosted three team meetings before our group reached a unanimous decision to focus on voter registration.

Nearly everyone in the class has participated in raising awareness about voter registration and our civic duty to vote. The class has set up three committees which include; Materials Committee (Team Leader, Dave McFawn), Events
