What's Up With Larry Warren (11)

Location, Location, Location



Larry Warren, President and CEO of KPCW, was born in Sioux Falls, South Dakota but he has been a "local" for quite a while.

He first laid eyes on Park City in 1970 when he transferred to the U of U from Denver University to pursue a journalism degree. *"I visited Park City frequently from 1970-72, guessed that someday it could amount to something and made a permanent move back in 1980."*

Like most TV reporters, Larry was a gypsy early in his career, moving up from smaller to larger markets. *"I've lived in Great Falls, Montana...Rhineland and Madison, Wisconsin prior to returning to Utah to take a job at KUTV in Salt Lake."*

A return to Utah seemed like a great idea. "It was the perfect work/play combo. Salt Lake, at the time had some of the best TV news operations in the country-especially KSL and KUTV- and it was just a 25 minute commute from a major ski town. It was a combination available nowhere else in the U.S....probably nowhere in the world."

With a career involving both TV and radio, Larry has had some memorable experiences. *"KUTV was an extraordinary place to work and offered its reporters amazing opportunities to pursue quality journalism. I've been in the Oval office with the President, on the Iditarod Trail in Alaska and in Red Square in Moscow and a thousand datelines in between on three different continents. Journalism offers up a different story and a different experience every day and a chance to access places and people few others can reach."*

"Switching to radio in Park City has offered more of an intimate aspect of journalism," explained Larry, *"drilling down into the issues which touch each of us. It is public service...journalism at its best and I am proud to have a role in protecting and promoting one of America's great community radio stations."*

KPCW has twice been nominated for the Marconi Award, as the "Noncommercial Radio Station of the Year" by the National Association of Broadcasters. *"Our brand of local journalism on community radio is rare in today's challenging media environment."*

"I'm in touch with many of my Leadership friends and hired one of my classmates, Lynn Ware Peek, who is a stellar program host and reporter. Other Leadership alumni on staff include Emily Elliot (20) and Monika Guendner (15) and literally dozens of our volunteer deejays also have Leadership credentials."

If Larry were to be handed a ticket to a 3 week fully paid adventure it would be a toss up where to go. *"I'd be torn between biking, kayaking, and sampling wine and cuisine in France or doing pretty much the same things in Hawaii."*

Even though Larry has been in Park City a long time he can still be amazed. *"What continues to amaze me are the daily 'only in Park City' moments. Only in Park City would someone find a lost cat and have it professionally groomed before returning it to its owner. Only in Park City would the parking lot guy be a jet pilot with 20,000 hours in the cockpit. Only in Park City would there be a radio station that interrupts programming to warn of a bear on the golf course or a moose on Main Street. Only in Park City would the chairlift hold a tech billionaire and a guy living in his car and they're having equally good times at the exact same experience."*

KPCW has adopted "Only in Park City" as their tag line to point out the uniqueness of this place. Larry and Carol plan to be part of this uniqueness for the duration. *"Our most recent real estate investment was at the Park City Cemetery, so you could say we're here to stay."*
