



What's Up With Sydney Reed (4)

Sydney Reed (4) is another east coast transplant...New Jersey born and raised...but a New Yorker before moving to Park City in 1974. *"When I married Harry Reed," explained Sydney, "I moved here. He'd found Park City years earlier and loved it."*

We, Parkites, are lucky that Sydney loved Harry and Harry loved Park City because they evolved into two remarkable citizens.

According to Sydney, Harry had always loved the west and had moved here for a summer job in 1963. Later, when Park City opened up he worked as a ski patroller and then a ski instructor living on \$50 a month. After a 4 year stint as a helicopter in Viet Nam, he rushed back to continue instructing but also got his real estate and broker's license and worked out of the house he'd purchased on Main Street. Eventually, he got involved in development and did Snowflower Condos and then, with partner Skip Schirf, a long list of others.

"He loved the history and helped coordinate the moving of the Mid Mountain Lodge, the bridge connecting the town to the mountains and the trolley up and down Main Street to encourage skiers to come to the historic district for lunch," added Sydney.

Harry loved skiing and continued to ski several times a week with friends, family and business associates. He easily gathered a gang to mountain or road bike every Saturday, for a while raced sailboats and spent time on the golf course. Harry passed away December 17, 2011.

are educated, informed and grow up cared for. It's important that our quality of life is preserved, whether its outdoor activities like trails and open space or preserving our culture and history. Our town's vitality is maintained by preserving our

heritage." Sydney feels her life, and all our lives have been enriched by the nonprofits in town.

One of Sydney's favorite organizations is the Historical Society & Museum. She first got involved in the 80's when her children were in school. She served for 3 years on the Board of Directors and then, being an educator, became the first educational coordinator. *"The more I learned about Park City history, the more fascinated I became about how far we'd come. We hiked around to find the old mines, learned the stories about all the artifacts on teh mountains and got an understanding about the community as it developed in the 1800's."*

The town became more and more sophisticated as more mining companies arrived and became successful.

"It was interesting to learn about the millionaires who benefited from the place and realize the effect Park City had on our state. Our town's rogue attitude provided the spark and resourcefulness that pulled our community through fires, economic depression, mine closures and allowed us to rise again from a ski resort town to a world class resort community. It fascinates me to see how we've also managed to sustain a viable community through it all. We've been special from the beginning!"

Over her 42 years of Park City life.....Syd has fond memories of those early days. *"I remember mostly how we were all new here. We all lived away from home and were making our lives. We all supported each other in our ideas, ventures, and our families. We always had pot-luck dinners, picnics, ski outings. We all supported someone's new idea. Radio station? Sure! Art Center? Great! New development? Interesting idea? How about a Sewer District? Someone sick? Let's all have a party and fundraise for them. Someone's home caught on fire? We all helped clean, fix and support them. Actually this town is still that way, and if you read about the Fire of 1898 it always has been this way."*

Of course, things change and change can be a good thing. There have been some fantastic new additions to our town. *"There are , more businesse opportunities for young adults to find their niche, (so our kids can be here), many more opportunities for kids in school, "* added Sydney, *"and many more cultural events, lectures, and entertainment than ever. It is great we have many more non-profits that are meeting the needs of our growing community. I think this is all great. "*

When Sydney closes her eyes and conjures images of a favorite Park City day, what does she see? *"Sharing with others involved in a great cause, hiking, biking or skiing with friends and family and then gathering for a shared meal."*

"I love Park City. I feel like a grew up here, friends are true and loyal to each other, people care about the place. I wouldn't want to live any other place."
